EPIC WALKING TOUR OF THE VIKING TRIANGLE

The Epic Walking Tour of the Viking Triangle introduces visitors to the great stories of Ireland's oldest city from the Vikings to the Victorians. This walking tour covers a thousand years of history in a thousand paces. Here in the Viking Triangle, guests will meet warring Vikings, be inspired by medieval wonders and elegant Georgian architecture.



THE MEDIEVAL MUSEUM

The Medieval Museum, Ireland's only purpose-built Medieval Museum, incorporates two medieval chambers: the 13th-century Choristers Hall and 15th Century Wine vault. Guests can view incredible artefacts including the only complete set of Medieval Cloth of Gold Vestments in Northern Europe which had been buried for almost 125 years.



THE BISHOP'S PALACE

The Bishop's Palace is an 18th-century Georgian home containing a stunning collection of Irish treasures, including the oldest piece of Waterford Crystal ever made - The Penrose Decanter.



THE IRISH SILVER MUSEUM

The Irish Silver Museum is an intimate and personal collection of silver treasures from Ireland. From the Vikings to the Victorians, our collection has been created by Ireland's virtuoso craftsmen over the course of a millennium. The collection offers a rare opportunity to step back in time and explore the fascinating story of Ireland through its magnificent silver treasures.



THE IRISH MUSEUM OF TIME

Ireland's National Horological Museum features the oldest Irish-made grandfather clocks and watches in the world and celebrates the incredible skills of the virtuoso craftsmen who, since the seventeenth century, created timepieces of remarkable beauty and technological genius.



THE KING OF THE VIKINGS

This award-winning virtual reality adventure gives guests the opportunity to get up close and personal with the Vikings who founded Waterford over 1000 years ago. Experience the thrill of raiding the Viking settlement they called 'Vadrefjordyr'. The King of the Vikings is the world's first Viking VR adventure.



THE IRISH WAKE MUSEUM

The Irish Wake is a celebration of life, which evolved from the ancient Celtic wake. Explore the history and traditions surrounding this amazing custom. Learn about where it all began, why these traditions have carried on into modern Ireland and how they differ from funeral rites around the world.





THE KING OF THE VIKINGS -VIRTUAL REALITY

Introduce your students to an exciting virtual reality adventure where they will get up close and personal with the Vikings who founded are city in 914AD. Students will witness the Vikings seize control of the settlement that we now call Waterford in the world's first Virtual Reality Viking Experience.

History Heroes

Learn about Waterford's history through great characters that once walked our streets. Examine their lives and objects associated with them as part of this workshop that takes students through 1000 years of Waterford's history using fun games and activities. Students will work in groups to inhabit these history heroes & will participate in object handling.

Life in Viking Waterford

Curator tours

How long does a visit to Waterford Treasures take?

A visit will take about one to two hours depending on the tour/experience selected for your students. Our guided tours of each museum will take between 45 minutes and 1 hour. Our educational experiences will take between 90 minutes and 2 hours. All of our museums are within five minutes walk of each other and a one minute walk to Waterford Crystal.
